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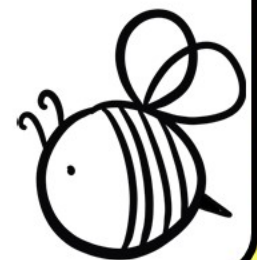
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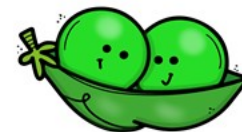
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Peas in a pod



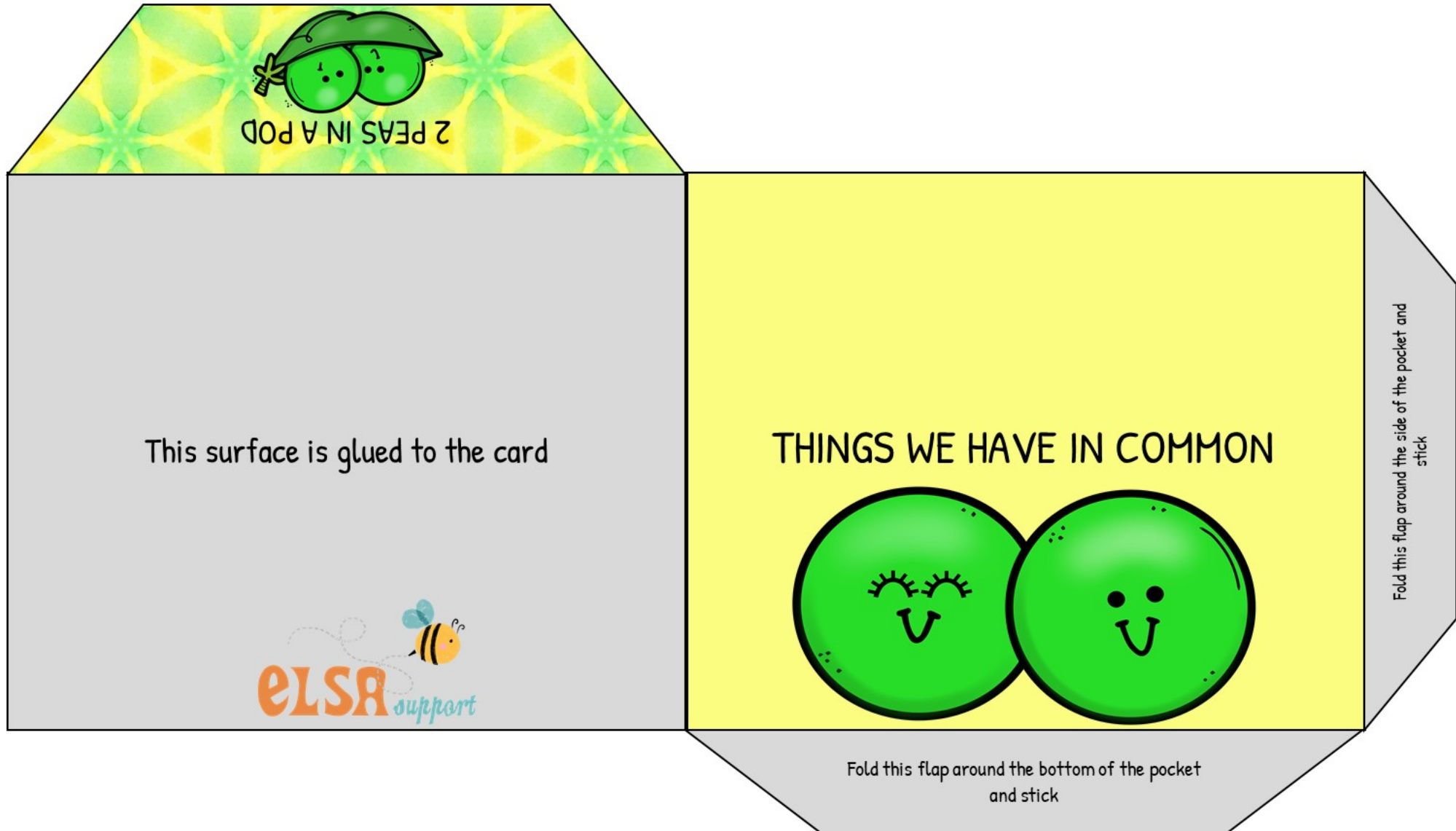
The purpose of this activity is for children to explore things they have in common with their friend. It is a crafty type activity where children can cut out the pocket and fill in the cards to collect ideas on things they have in common. They can stick it into an exercise book or onto a strong piece of card...

This can be added to as an ongoing activity. This will make them aware of how friends often need to have common ground, things they both like, things they agree with, things they enjoy doing and so on.
